Who We Are

We are a 501c3 nonprofit and member center of PATH International (Professional Association of Therapeutic Horsemanship) located in Springfield, GA.

Programs

- Equine-Assisted Activities-We offer groundwork and riding activities to individuals with special abilities to help them build life skills that will make a difference in their daily lives.
- Supported Employment-We provide on-site employment and volunteer opportunities for individuals with special needs after high school graduation in order to help them build job skills and confidently enter the workforce. Each employee is paired with a job mentor that provides them with one-on-one support and supervision while promoting independence.

• Fostered and post-adopted children (Blue Sky Moments)-We pair volunteer mentors with children in foster care to help them build a stable adult relationship which will allow them to find the resilience to overcome the trauma they have experienced.


2023 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Purchased 43.16 acres of land on March 22nd, 2023.
- We obtained our rural business license to operate on site.
- Improvements were made to the house onsite including new roof, windows and flooring.
- GAP Ministries built a ramp on Blue Sky Acres property to the house, making it wheelchair accessible.
- A Handi-House was installed on property, which will serve as a temporary workshop for the Supported Employment program. The building was insulated, installed with a minisplit and outfitted for use.
- Soil testing was completed by Troy Smith.
- Wetlands testing was completed by Resource Land Consultants.
- A Boundary Survey was completed by Buddy Fulcher.
- Run-in shed (shelter for our future horses) was completed by a group from FBC Rincon.
- Pasture fencing was installed for horses.
- Prograde South completed property clearing and cleanup projects.

- Freddie Tuten began maintaining our hay fields and had one cutting.
- Woodmen Life completed a volunteer work project to paint our round pen and installed a flagpole onsite.
- Thomas and Hutton assisted us with completing a site plan for the property.
- Held Blue Sky Acres Fun Day at RCOG.
- Round pen footing was put in place and round pen was installed with the help of equipment from Reeves Construction Company and Joe Marchese Construction and dirt from McGraley.
- Obtained grants from International Paper and Planters Telephone Foundation for fencing materials and property improvements.
- New water lines were put in place with the help of Southern Pride Landscaping and Joe Marchese Construction Company.
- 2nd Annual Golf Tournament-a total of 31 teams participated raising a total of \$41,984.04 after expenses.
- 2nd Annual Clay Tournament netted close to \$9,400.

STORIES

When Caleb first came to us, we were told that he works too hard, making it challenging for his employers to find enough things to keep him busy! When he first joined our staff, there was a learning curve for us to make sure we had a plan in place but we were consistently impressed by Caleb's work ethic and the smile on his face that he experiences when he is doing what he loves.

When we were filming a video about our Supported Employees and our Program Director, Jackie Garman, was interviewing the employees about what they do in a day. She had a very interesting conversation with Caleb.

Jackie: What else do we do in the morning? Do we pray?

Caleb: Oh yeah, we pray to God! (as he does this, he looks up to the sky and holds his hands up as though God is right there!)

Jackie: We pray that He will keep us safe right? Caleb: Oh yeah because God, He helps me every day!

Caleb has been such a perfect fit for our program, especially since we moved onto our new property! Watching these moments is such a reminder to us to slow down and be grateful for the little things in our work day that give us joy. This is enough reason to stop for a few seconds and thank the One who helps us every single day!









Our employee, Matthew, has Down Syndrome and one of his goals is to be able to communicate more effectively.

Even though Matthew has a limited vocabulary, he is finding ways to demonstrate his understanding of the way tools are used in the BSA workshop and communicate this understanding to his mentor.

For example, we recently moved the workshop from another location onto BSA's new property. The mentor working with Matthew at that time is an accomplished woodworker and was setting up the miter saw.

Part of the setup is a 6-inch block of wood that is placed in a specific area on the saw table which is used to cut the boards to the correct lengths. The mentor had forgotten about this block of wood. Matthew pointed to a board and then pointed to the miter saw.

When he saw a confused look on the mentor's face, Matthew picked up a pencil and drew a line six inches from the end, indicating that it needed to be cut.

When the mentor was still confused, Matthew drew a smiley face on the block to match the one we were using previously (see picture above). At that point, the mentor remembered and understood what Matthew was telling him.

This exchange demonstrates Matthew's ability to find ways to communicate and taking initiative to communicate so that he could accomplish a task.

The part that makes this story even better is that our Program Director, Jackie Garman, had been praying that very morning for each of the employees on her way to work and specifically prayed that Matthew would be able to communicate that day!
